TERMS

PUBLIC HEALTH

- Is the science and art of preventing disease, prolonging life and promoting health, and efficiency through **organized community effort**
- To enable every citizen to realize his **birthright** to enable health and longevity (**Dr. C. E. Winslow**)
- The art of science in the context of politics so as to reduce inequalities in health while ensuring the **best health for the greater number**

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING

The practice of nursing in **national** and **local** government health departments (which include health centers and rural health units) and public schools. It is community health nursing practiced in the **public sector**

COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSING

- Utilization of the nursing process (**ADPHE**) in the different levels of clientele
- Individuals, **families**, population groups, communities
- Concerned with **promotion of health, prevention of disease and disability rehabilitation** (according to **Aracelis Maglaya**)
- Goal:** raise level of health of the **community** by helping communities and families cope with the discontinuities in and threats to health and maximize their potential for high level wellness
 - This goal is achieved through multi-sectoral efforts

LEVELS OF CLIENTELE OF CHN

- Community : Patient
- Family : Unit of care
- Part of the health care system and the larger human services system
- 4 Levels of Clientele – Individual, Family, Population Group, Community**

INDIVIDUAL

- Sick, or well
- Seek consultation (different settings)
- Entry point in the family

FAMILY

- Small social system**
- 2 or more** people living together
- Blood / marriage / adoption / arrangement over a period of time

FAMILY COMPOSITION

- Nuclear family** – father + mother + child/children
- Extended family** – nuclear + **relatives** of one or both spouses
- Blended family** – composed of one separated/**divorced** or widowed adult with his/her children, they live together in one household (ex: Kardashians)
- Single-parent** – composed of **either** father or mother with his/her biological or adopted children
- Same sex/homosexual family** – composed of **gay**/lesbian partners living together
- Cohabiting or communal family** – consists of **unrelated** individuals or families who live together under one roof for

purposes of companionship, desiring to achieve a sense of family.

BASED ON LOCUS OF POWER

You consider this bc to see how it influences the family

- Patriocal/Patriarchal family** – a union in which the **man** has the main authority and decision-making power
- Matrifocal/ Matriarchal family** – a union in which the **woman** has the main authority and decision-making power
- Egalitarian** – **equal** amount of authority
- Matricentric** – prolonged absence of the father as in the case of families of **OFWs** which gives the **mother a dominant** position in the family, although the **father** may in a way **share the decision-making** power with the mother

FAMILY HEALTH TASK

- Achieve wellness
 - Recognize **problems**
 - Decision-making**
 - Nursing care
 - Home environment
 - Community resources
- It is the nurse's responsibility to assess whether the family is able to attend to these tasks or not
- Failure in Family Nursing Problems**

POPULATION

- A **group of people**
- Sharing same characteristics, developmental state, exposure to environment would mean common health problems

COMMUNITY

- A group of people sharing **geographic boundaries**, values, and interests, and "**cultural heritage**"
- " – each is unique
- Consists of :
 - a. Geographic boundaries
 - b. Institutions, Network, Communication
 - c. Common interest
 - d. Problem can be identified = solved
 - e. Populations
