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web one type of titration uses a neutralization reaction in which an acid and a base react to produce a salt and water in equation 1 the acid is  $\text{HCl}$  hydrochloric acid and the base is  $\text{NaOH}$  sodium hydroxide when the acid and base react they form  $\text{NaCl}$  sodium chloride which is also known as table salt

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
