The central argument of this book is that the half century of Russian rule in Central Asia was shaped by traditions of authoritarian rule by Russian national interests and by a civic reform agenda that brought to Turkestan the principles that informed Alexander II s reform policies This civilizing mission sought to lay the foundations for a rejuvenated modern empire unified by imperial citizenship patriotism and a shared secular culture Evidence for Brower s thesis is drawn from major archives in Uzbekistan and Russia Use of these records permitted him to develop the first interpretation either in Russian or Western literature of Russian colonialism in Turkestan that draws on the extensive archival evidence of policy making imperial objectives and relations with subject peoples      **Common Destiny** Dietrich Orlow, 2000-03-01 Although the Socialist or Social Democratic parties played a key role in West European politics during the quarter century after the Second World War they have been studied far less than their political rivals the Christian Democrats The story of West European Social Democracy after 1945 begins with a dilemma Democratic marxism which had been the parties ideological and organizational principle until the Second World War was becoming politically irrelevant The three parties analyzed here represent the spectrum of reactions among Social Democratic parties to this realization The debate over the parties programs and ideologies did not of course take place in a vacuum the author devotes considerable space to a comparative analysis of the parties leaders and organizational structures as well as the evolution of Social Democratic domestic and foreign policies Immensely readable this book not only offers an in depth analysis of the postwar period crucial for the history of Social Democracy but also because of its cross national treatment of these three major parties adds significantly to our understanding of the processes of European integration and the evolution of the Atlantic Alliance      *Erased* Patricia Owens, 2025-03-11 How a field built on the intellectual labor and expertise of women erased them The academic field of international relations presents its own history as largely a project of elite white men And yet women played a prominent role in the creation of this new cross disciplinary field In *Erased* Patricia Owens shows that since its beginnings in the early twentieth century international relations relied on the intellectual labour of women and their expertise on such subjects as empire and colonial administration anticolonial organising non Western powers and international organisations Indeed women were among the leading international thinkers of the era shaping the development of the field as scholars journalists and public intellectuals and as heterosexual spouses and intimate same sex partners Drawing on a wide range of archival sources and weaving together personal institutional and intellectual narratives Owens documents key moments and locations in the effort to forge international relations as a separate academic discipline in

Britain She finds that women's ideas and influence were first marginalised and later devalued ignored and erased Examining the roles played by some of the most important women thinkers in the field including Margery Perham Merze Tate Eileen Power Margaret Cleeve Coral Bell and Susan Strange Owens traces the intellectual and institutional legacies of misogyny and racism She argues that the creation of international relations was a highly gendered and racialised project that failed to understand plurality on a worldwide scale Acknowledging this intellectual failure and recovering the history of women in the field points to possible sources for its renewal **Decolonizing Global Mental Health** China Mills, 2014-04-11

Decolonizing Global Mental Health is a book that maps a strange irony The World Health Organization WHO and the Movement for Global Mental Health are calling to scale up access to psychological and psychiatric treatments globally particularly within the global South Simultaneously in the global North psychiatry and its often chemical treatments are coming under increased criticism from both those who take the medication and those in the position to prescribe it The book argues that it is imperative to explore what counts as evidence within Global Mental Health and seeks to de-familiarize current Western conceptions of psychology and psychiatry using postcolonial theory It leads us to wonder whether we should call for equality in global access to psychiatry whether everyone should have the right to a psychotropic citizenship and whether mental health can or should be global As such it is ideal reading for undergraduate and postgraduate students as well as researchers in the fields of critical psychology and psychiatry social and health psychology cultural studies public health and social work **The Last British Liberals in Africa** Dickson Mungazi, 1999-05-30 A study of the clash of two

traditions British liberalism and African nationalism and an examination of how Michael Blundell in Kenya and Garfield Todd in Zimbabwe used their liberal backgrounds to further the future of their adopted countries despite threats and detention Both Blundell and Todd believed that political leaders had a responsibility to serve the needs of the people as a condition of national development By the time each came to power European colonization had had a profoundly negative effect on the lives of Africans Blundell and Todd sought to correct this by putting their positive views of Africans into practice While colonial governments designed strategies for controlling Africans to serve political and economic interests at home in Europe Africans themselves established their own effective strategy not only to ensure their survival in the colonial setting but also to initiate a process for the restoration of their sense of self Michael Blundell and Garfield Todd with their liberal beliefs served as excellent allies in this period of a rising African consciousness Using sources obtained in Kenya and Zimbabwe over the past 15 years this work examines democratic traditions that have survived tumultuous times in recent years Medical

misadventure in an age of professionalisation, 1780-1890 Alannah Tomkins, 2017-07-21 This book looks at medical professionalisation from a new perspective one of failure rather than success It questions the existing picture of broad and rising medical prosperity across the nineteenth century to consider the men who did not keep up with professionalising trends It unpicks the life stories of men who could not make ends meet or who could not sustain a professional persona of

disinterested expertise either because they could not overcome public accusations of misconduct or because they struggled privately with stress In doing so it uncovers the trials of the medical marketplace and the pressures of medical masculinity All professionalising groups risked falling short of rising expectations but for doctors these expectations were inflected in some occupationally specific ways

**Dutch Culture Overseas** Frances Gouda, 2008 European colonial expansion led to Dutch notions of civilised society or the Dutch s community s flexible and relatively charitable attitudes toward others being scattered as in the Greek word diaspeirein to the four corners of the earth In some cases the exportation of Dutch cultural values to places overseas like North America endowed Dutchness with subtle new meanings But in colonial Indonesia Dutch political customs and traditions were transformed in the process of migrating to exotic locales In this book Frances Gouda examines the ways in which the Netherlands portrayed its unique colonial style to the outside world Why were citizens of a small and politically insignificant European nation able to represent as natural and normal their dominance over ancient civilizations on islands such as Java and Bali How did Dutch colonial residents explain the cultural differences between themselves and the supposedly primitive peoples of the Indonesian archipelago In trying to understand the gendering practices of colonial governance in the Netherlands East Indies Gouda also explores the interactions of Dutch and Indonesian women with European men FRANCES GOUDA earned a Ph D in history from the University of Washington in Seattle in 1980 She is currently professor of history and gender studies in the Political Science Department of the University of Amsterdam
