The story tollows a young prince who visits various planets, including Earth, and addresses themes of ioneliness, thendohip, love, and loss. Despite its style as a children's book, The Little Prince makes observations about life, adults, and human nature. The Little Prince became Saint-Exupéry's most successful work, selling an estimated 140 million copies worldwide, which makes it one of the best-selling in history.
